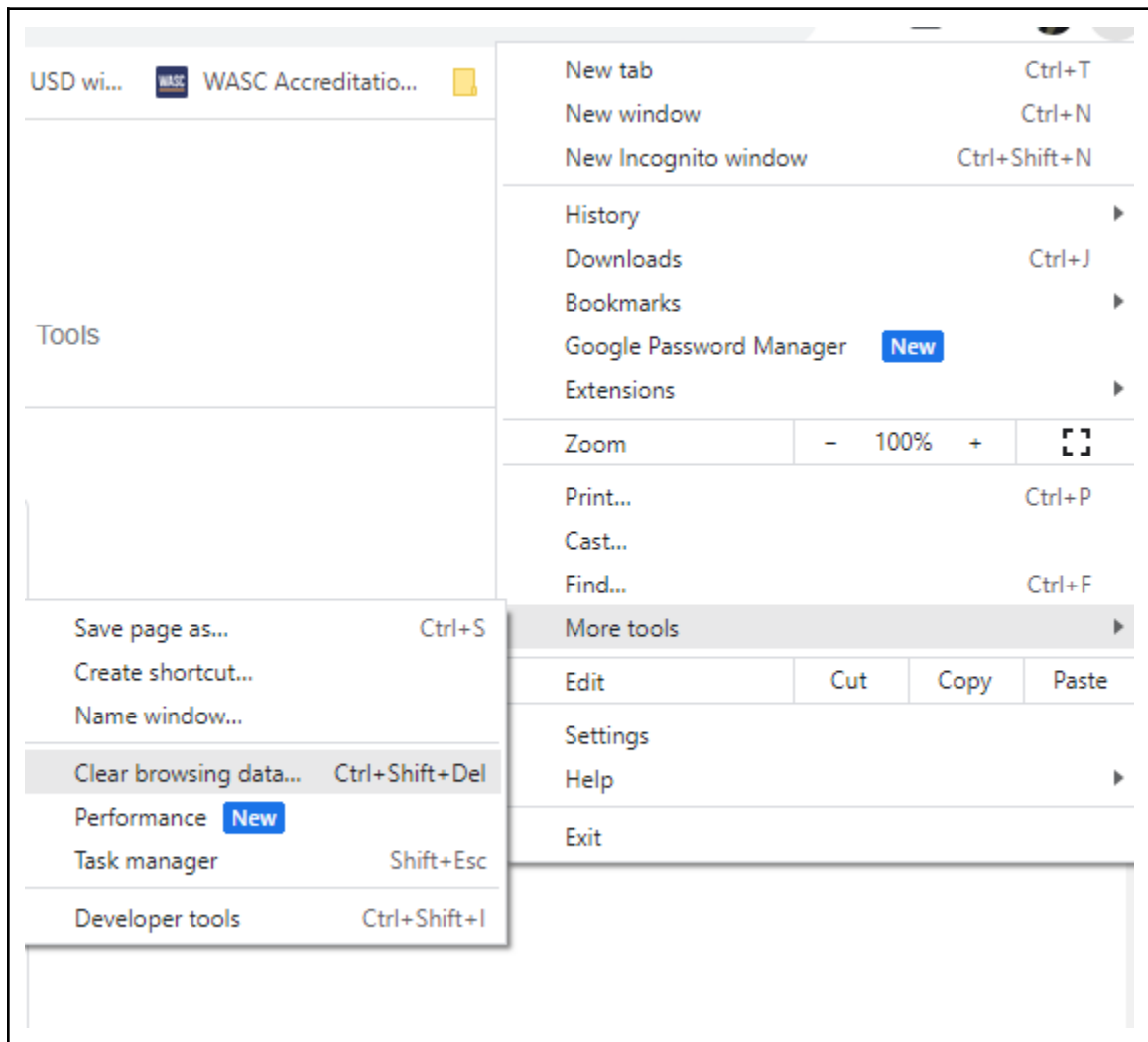
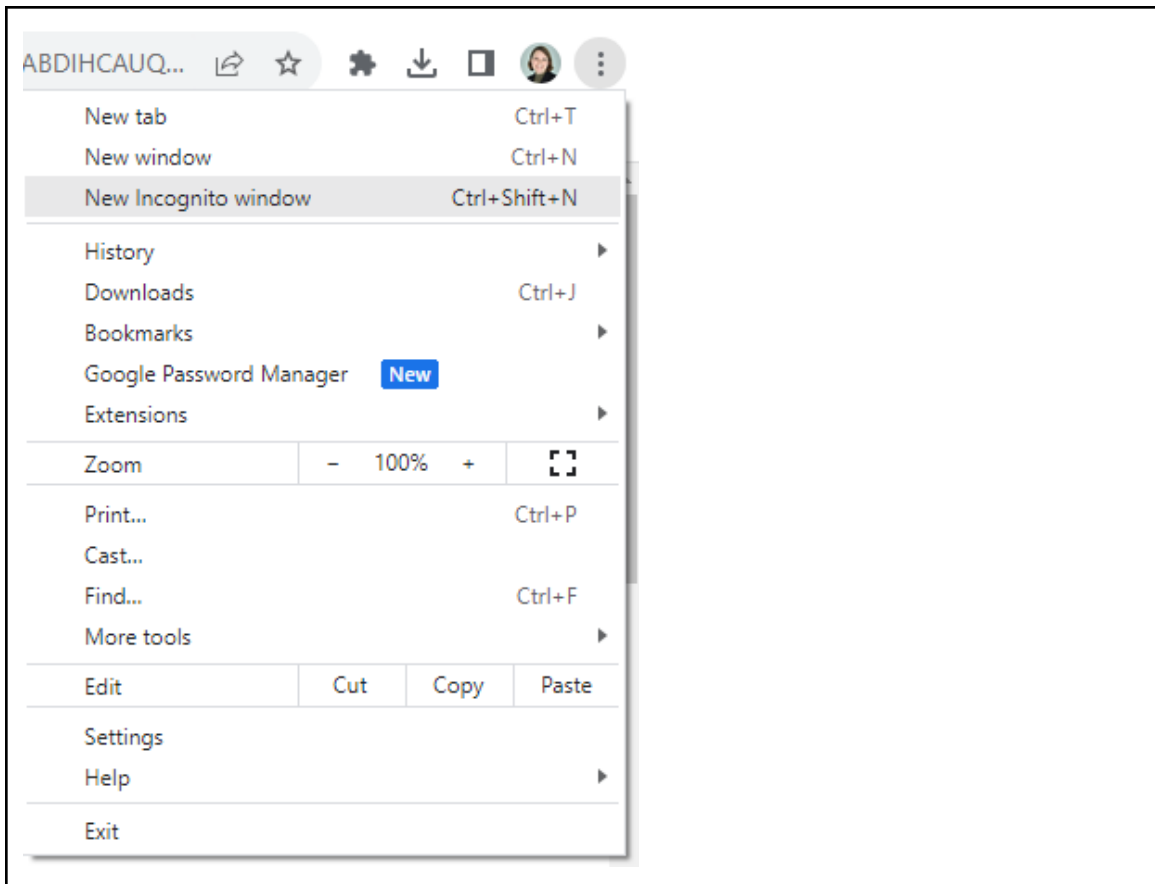


How To Access Microsoft Project for Students

1. Clear the cache and cookies of the browser you are using. Within the Chrome app select More in the top right corner of your browser. Tap History, then select Clear browsing data. At the top, choose a time range. To delete everything, select All time. Next to "Cookies and site data" and "Cached images and files," check the boxes. Tap Clear data.

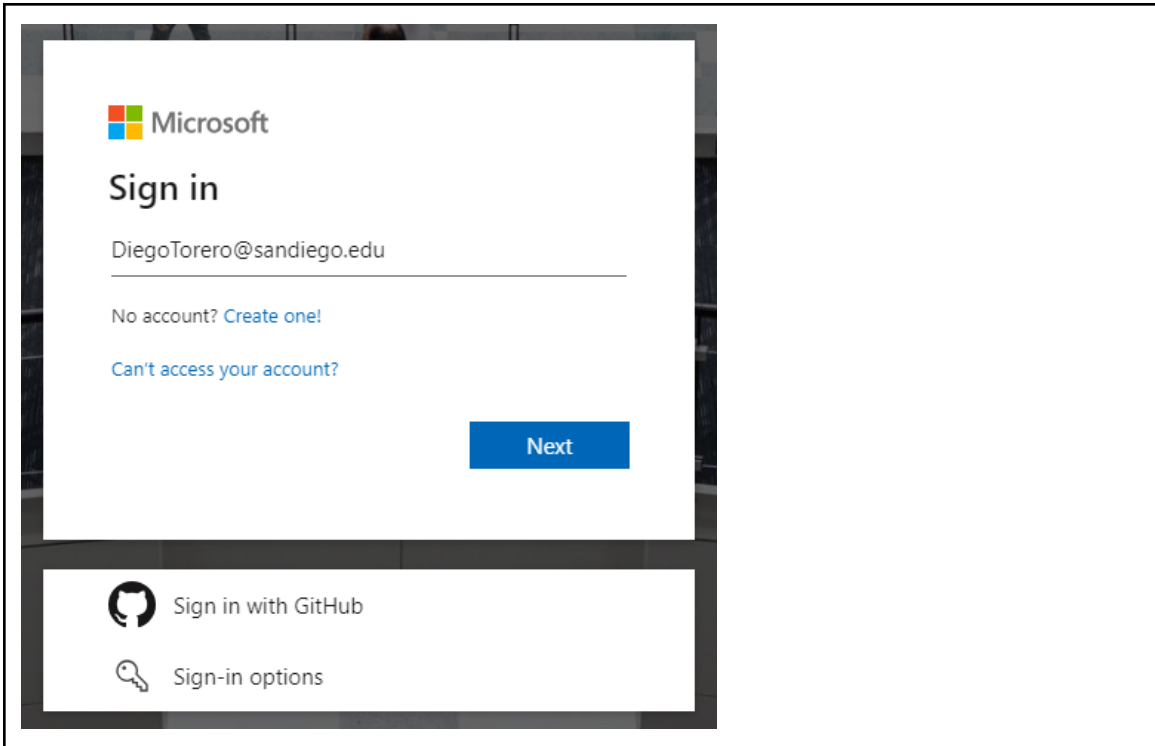


2. Use InPrivate or Incognito browser via selecting from the top right corner of your browser.

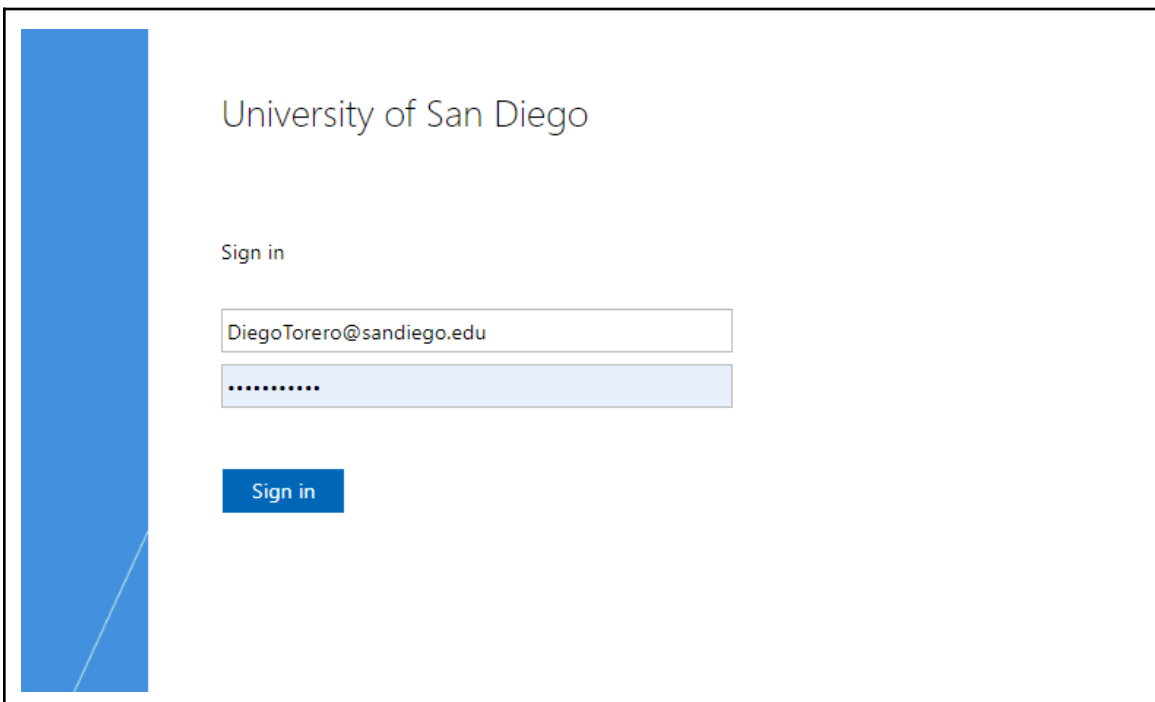


3. Go to <https://signup.azure.com/studentverification?offerType=3>.

4. Enter your email address and password then hit 'Next'.



5. Upon signing in, you may be asked to agree to the terms and conditions and the Academic/Student verification (for first time users). If not, you should be routed to the Education | Overview page.

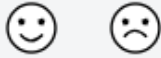
